Paris, Oct. 6. N. S. A Relation of the last Affault made on Barcelona, and of the taking of that Place, has been published here by Authority. The chief Part culars are these following. The Mines having been rendered unferviceable by Rain which fell the 9th of September in the Night, the Marshal Berwick refolved not to wait for the Effect they might have had when the Wa er should be drained off, and they should be put into a Condition again to be fprung, but the Breaches laid open by the Artillery being judged fufficient, he made the Difpofi ions for giving the general Affault the 11th. Seven Battalions, with their 7 Companies of Grenadiers, and 200 Workmen, were appointed for the Attack on the Right; 13 Battalions, with their Grenadiers, and 300 Workmen, for that in the Centre; and the Command in chief of both these Attacks was committed to Lieutenant-General Dillon: The Command of the Attack on the Left, was given to Lieutenant-General de Silly, with 10 Battalions, their Grenadiers, and 300 Workmen. The Marshal Berwick took upon himself the Command of the Body of Referve, confifting of 9 Battalions, 14 Companies of Grenadiers and 300 Workmen. The Signal for moving to the Affault, was given the 1 1th at half an Hour part 4, in the Morning. The 7 Battalions on the Right, carried after some Relistance the Bastion of the New-Gate, in which were 3 Intrenchments, put to the Sword 150 Men who did not retire out of them time enough, and possessed themselves of the Gorge of that Bastion, and of the Head of the great Coupure, which began between the Baftion of St. Peter and that of the New-Gate. The Attack in the Centre was made by M. le Guerchois, with 6 Battallions, who mounted the Breach in the Baftion of St. Claire; and the other 7 Battallions, led by M. Dillon in Person, mounted the grand Breach. They carried all the Coupure which was behind the Monastry of St. Augustine, and part of that Monastry: That Attack was begun with great Caution, because twas known there were Mines in that Part of the Works; but they did not blow up, which made it supposed the Water had run into them as well as into those of the Besiegers.
