ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

THE M60 MOTORWAY (JUNCTION 5, ANTICLOCKWISE EXIT SLIP ROAD TO THE A5103) (PROHIBITION OF TRAFFIC) ORDER 2000

The Secretary of State for the Environment, Transport and the Regions gives notice that he intends to make an Order under section 1(1), 2(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The Order if made as proposed would prohibit all motor vehicles with an overall width exceeding 2 metres (6' 6") from entering or proceeding in the offside lane (lane 2) of the exit slip road leading from the

anticlockwise carriageway of the M60 Motorway at Junction 5 to the A5103.

The following exemptions have been provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to enter or proceed in the offside lane:

- (i) in accordance with any direction or permission given by a police officer in uniform;
- (ii) in order to prevent an accident or to obtain or give help required as the result of an accident;
- (iii) for the maintenance, repair, cleaning, clearance, alteration or improvement of any part of that motorway;
- (iv) for fire, police or ambulance purposes;
- (v) for the removal of any vehicle from any part of the motorway;
- (vi) for the erection, laying, placing, maintenance, testing, alteration, repair or removal of any structure, works or apparatus in, on, under or over any part of the motorway;
- (vii) where the nearside lane is unavailable to traffic.
