**A**N humble Address of the Council and Representatives of the Province of the Massachusetts-Bay in New-England, having been transmitted hither, has been presented to His Majesty by his Grace the Duke of Newcastle one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

Which Address His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously.

Stockholm, March 16, O. S. The King and Queen of Sweden having received Notifications from the Court of Prussia, of the Death of the second Daughter of the Markgrave Albrecht of Brandenburg, this Court went into Mourning last Sunday on that Occasion for three Weeks. Last Week the King of Sweden conferred the Bishoprick of Gottenbourg, (which See became vacant by the Death of Dr. Carlson) on Dr. Erick Bentzelius Library-Keeper of the University of Upsal, who is generally esteemed one of the most learned Men of this Kingdom.

Lisbon, March 23, N. S. On the 15th Instant, their Portuguese Majesties went to the Palace of the Inquisition to see the Procession of all the Nobility on Foot, which was at that Time made with the usual Devotion from St. Roque to the Graça. The same Day, being the Birth-Day of the Prince Dom Antonio, was celebrated at Court with great Splendour. On the 16th Instant Vice-Admiral Somelldyck, with the Dutch Squadron under his Command, failed from hence to cruize upon this Coast; as did on the 20th the Fleet for the Bahia, consisting of 16 Sail, under the Convoy of one Man of War: Four Ships designed to have gone with this Fleet, not having taken their full Lading on board, are detained here till the Pernambuco Fleet sails, which it is thought will be ready by the Middle of next Month. Last Week 29 British Ships entered this Port from different Parts, most of which were laden with Wheat and Rye. On the 21st Instant at Night arrived here a Courier from Vienna, dispatched by the Conde de Tarouca to this Court: He brings Advice of the Elector of Bavaria's Death.

His Majesty's said Commissioners have caused this Publick Notice to be given, in Hopes thereby to prevent for the future a Practice so prejudicial to the Revenue under their Care.
