*From his Royal Highness's Council Chamber at Somerset House, the 27th Day of January 1735.*

**T**HIS Day his Royal Highness the Prince of Wales was pleased to appoint Ferdinando Wallis, of Shevioc, in the County of Cornwall, Esq; to be Sheriff of the said County.

*Hague, Feb. 7, N. S.* Some Days ago Complaints came from the States of Guelderland, that certain Prussian Officers had anew by Force lifted and carried off some Men from that Province: Upon which Complaints the States General first sent for an exact Information of the Matters of Fact, which having been transmitted to them, their High Mightinesses passed a Resolution on the 5th Instant, to order M. de Ginkel, their Minister at the Court of Berlin, to complain of this violent Proceeding towards their Subjects, and to demand Satisfaction. Which Resolution, together with the said Information, was dispatched to him this Morning, and likewise delivered to M. Luiscius, the Prussian Minister here. The States of Holland separated on Saturday last, after having settled some Matters relating to the Diques of Gorcom and Schoonhoven, to prevent the frequent Inundations there. Count Uhlefeld returned hither from Brussels on Friday Night last, and is preparing to give a splen-

did Dinner to all the Publick Ministers and other Persons of Consideration on Monday next, on Occasion of the Marriage between the Archdutchess and the Duke of Lorrain.

The King has been pleased to constitute and appoint George Earl of Orkney, and his Grace John Duke of Argyll and Greenwich, to be Field Marshals of all and singular his Majesty's Forces, as well Horse as Foot, employed or to be employed in His Service.
