Hambourg, April 12.

HERE is Advice from Rostock, that the Populace had assembled there in a tumultuous Manner, while the prefent reigning Duke of Mechlemburgh was in Conference at the Town House with the Members of that Magustracy, insisting that the Prince should receive Satisfaction, and be reinstated in certain Rights and Privileges upon which the Magistrates had taken an Opportunity of encroaching during the late Troubles in that Dutchy; nor was it sufficient that the Duke sent his Chancellor, M. Stein, to assure the People that his Master had no farther Reafons of Complaint, they would have it confirmed to them from the Prince's own Mouth, who, to prevent any ill Consequence from the Continuance of fo tumultuous a Proceeding, repeated to them the same Assurances, upon which they began to disperse; however, when the last Letters came away, there yet reigned a good deal of Confusion.

Head Quarters at Hellinrouche, April 15. We continue in much the same Situation. The Enemy have not as yet broke Ground towards the Town, but as 50 Battering Pieces were landed this Day at Liege, it is supposed they will begin to break Ground this Evening. The last Division of his Britannick Majesty's Electoral Troops arrived the 12th.

Thomas Kemp, about the same Age, is a thin made Man, Five Feet eight or nine Inches high; of a fair Complexion, or little Pock-fretten and fresh Colour, Cape Coat and grizzle Peruke.

For the better discovering and bringing to Justice the said Gray and Kemp, the Commissioners of his Majesty's Customs do hereby promise at Reward of One hundred Pounds for the discovering and apprehending either of the said Persons (over and above the Reward of Fifty Pounds offered by the Keeper of Newgate;) to be paid by the Receiver General and Cashire of the Customs, upon their being apprehended and committed to Goal.
